## Treasurer Report – *Louise Aston*

This is my eighth year as Treasurer, to which I have pleasure in reporting the results for the Financial Year 2021-2022.

We had another great season financially, due to the hard work of our members. With the help of various grants equating to \$22,841 we have been able to allocate funds to make additional purchases as listed below. Please note funds have been received for some of these items scheduled to be purchased over the next 12 months:

- \$4,000 – Australian Government Volunteer Grant 2021 – 2 laptops, printer, and toner
- \$1,000 – Vic Sport & Rec Club Grants Program 2021/2022 – Nippers Age Manager's long sleeve rashies.
- \$1,100 – Life Saving Victoria – Uniform Grant to be used for patrol uniforms.
- \$15,000 – BSEF 21/22 – Braydon CPR Manikin, 20kg youth body, training tourniquet, little Anne upgrade kit, Thundercat inflatables swim cans/ buoys, 50 bum bags, 3 heart start pads.
- \$1,341 – Quick Response Grant Sept 2021 – Various nippers equipment
- \$1,500 – Vic Sport & Rec Community Sport Sector Short-Term Survival Package – Operational expenses – Public Liability Insurance and Phone bills.

We hope to continue to strengthen our cash position over the coming season through the pursuit of various grants and further growth in our memberships. We hope our members will support us next season especially in our brand-new building.

Memberships for 2022 were \$24,891 which was slightly higher than 2021 (\$24,390). This is an amazing effort due to the conditions of operation whilst we commenced construction and operating out of shipping containers for the duration of the season.

We also renewed our term deposit with Bendigo Bank (including interest accrued).

Our (unaudited) cash flow and financial position are disclosed in the Profit and Loss Statement and Balance Sheet immediately following this report.

I would like to thank all the members for their support and look forward to this continuing for many years to come.

The brand of Aspendale LSC is being noticed in positive ways at state level due to the highly professional service we deliver.

May I take this chance to acknowledge and thank the families, partners and friends who give up their weekends with us; and let us get away with "I'm just popping in for a quick minute". We all know it's never a quick minute, we are always truly grateful for your support.

Please find summary of the 2021/22 season below.

### PATROLS

This year gave us a unique challenge of operating out of 5 shipping containers as the club was knocked down for redevelopment. Operating out of the Northern end of the Gnotuk Carpark naturally moved our usual flagged area closer to the beach boxes. This saw amazing benefit to our interaction with the community with increased beach attendance, preventative actions and first aid incidents.

The 5 patrol teams took the challenge of operating out of temporary facilities with an open mind. I am very impressed on how we were able to maintain the majority of our usual service delivery standards and the expectations of the community and LSV. This year we were granted a patrol variation, allowing us leniency around the use of IRBs to reflect the challenges of operating in open car park. This seemed like a precursor to LSV's state review of patrol protocols and how we best meet future expectations.

Acknowledgement needs to be given all patrollers who stepped up on our ADHOC hot weather patrols, especially over the Christmas – New Year break. Recognition also to Nick Lund and Erin Hall in assisting with an out of hours call out during the summer.
