Treasurer Report-Louise Aston

This is my eleventh and final year as Treasurer and I have pleasure in reporting the results for the Financial Year 2024-2025.

We had another great season financially, due to the hard work of all our members. With the help of various grants of just over \$15,000 we have been able to allocate funds to make some purchases as listed below:

- \$10,000 BSEF Grant 24/25 (Surf Life Saving Victoria) 2 new Patrol Shade Tents, new Brayden CPR Manikin and Defib Cabinet, a new Defib with pads and batteries.
- \$720.00 Dept of Jobs, Precincts and Regions (DJPR) for State Championships Grant
 Alex Henry for IRB Racing.
- \$750 Sporting Club Grants Program 2024/25 to each of four competitors to attend Maroochydore in September 2025. Jonah Dunn Whitney, Felix Nutting, Alexander Morina and Lucy Gothard.
- \$4,000 VESEP Grant 24/25 (Life Saving Victoria) IRB Thundercat, Board Racking and Motor Trolley. We still have approx. \$15,000 still to be reimbursed once we receive the new IRB which may be another 12 18 months.

Additionally, we also received various donations and sponsorships as follows:

- \$500 from Ciccio's Woodfired Pizzeria
- \$540 from Buxton Real Estate
- \$1,000 from SFS Pharmacy
- \$1,000 from Highett Podiatry
- \$1,000 from the Uniting by the Bay Opportunity Shop

We hope to continue to strengthen our cash position over the coming season through the pursuit of further grants and also additional growth in our memberships.

Memberships for 2025 were \$42,487.50, an increase from \$36,170 in 2024. This is an amazing effort as our memberships are increasing particularly now that we are up and running in our new club.

We also renewed our term deposit with Bendigo Bank (including interest accrued).

Our (unaudited) cash flow and financial position are disclosed in the Profit and Loss Statement and Balance Sheet immediately following this report.

This has been my last year as Treasurer and I have loved working with our fantastic committee's and members over the last eleven years and I thank you all for your support.

Aspendale is such a great Life Saving Club and I've been blessed to be able to be a part of it.


